Abstract evaluation criteria

Contributions should address 'AI' in some respect while clearly relating it to themes and issues commonly addressed within sociolinguistics, including but not limited to the ones listed in the call for papers.

All submissions will be evaluated anonymously by one or more members of the scientific committee in accordance with the following criteria.

All contributions (papers, posters and panel proposals):

- Originality of the topic and its relevance to the conference theme
- Relationship between title and content
- Structural organisation and clarity of the proposal, including central claims
- Theoretical, methodological and/or analytical appropriateness in relation to the conference theme

Panel proposals only:

- Coherence and synergy between individual contributions

Reviewers are asked to assign a score between 1 and 5 for each of the criteria listed above, provide brief feedback, and offer an overall recommendation ('accept', 'accept if space' or 'reject') for each submission. Reviewer scores, comments and recommendations will inform the final decision, which will be made by the conference organising committee.
